PRE-EXPO

EAR TAGGING/OWNERSHIP/ENTRY DEADLINE FOR MARKET:

- **9 am to Noon Saturday, November 14, 2009**-Prescott Frontier Day's Rodeo Grounds

ENTRY DUE AT TIME OF TAGGING:

All Entries Must Include:

- Signed and completed **Entry Form**, one form for each animal
- Legible **SIDE Color Photo** of animal with exhibitor
- **Bill of Sale**
- Copy of **Seasonal Pass** for entry. Original **Seasonal Pass** for transport to ear tagging.
- Signed **Code of Conduct Form**
- **Quality Assurance** certificate #
- Signed and completed form **W-9**
- **Entry Fee of \$15.00**, payable to "Yavapai County 4H/FFA EXPO" for each animal

Failure to bring all of the above accurately completed and signed to the tagging by Nov. 30th will result in a late fee assessment of \$25.00, for a total fee of \$35.00 per incomplete entry.

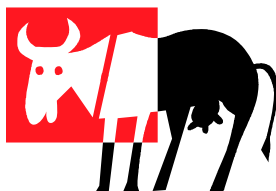

**** All steers will be weighed in and complete a manageability on official scale. All members MUST be able to lead their steers to the scales, off the scales and stop their steer by themselves with absolutely no assistance. Nose rings may NOT be used. Any steer found to be unmanageable and not meeting the sifting committee's final okay will be sifted from the project at this time.** Failure to attend manageability check and weigh-in may be grounds for disqualification. Veterinary verification for steers with health issues will be required to avoid disqualification.**

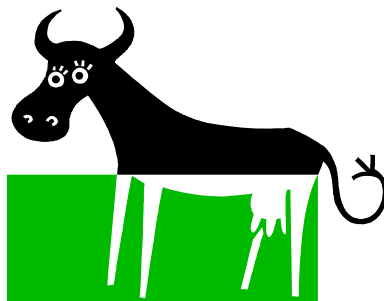

Division A - Dairy Cattle

Dairy Cattle Division Rules

1. Animals may be registered or grade. Classes will be developed according to entries received. Unless otherwise stated, all breeds to compete together.
2. Dairy Cattle will be classified according to the description for each breed. Dairy to dairy crosses will be permitted. **No Dairy/Beef Crosses will be accepted.**

Dairy Cattle Showmanship*

- Senior (age 15 – 18 years)
- Intermediate (age 12 – 14 years)
- Junior (age 9 to 11)
- Novice (**first year showing a particular species, all ages**)

****Champion Showman in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship will qualify to show in the Large Livestock Round Robin. If an individual qualifies in more than one species, they must choose one and allow the next placing individual in the show in the other species to compete.***

Division B - Breeding Beef

Breeding Beef Division Rules

1. Animals may be registered or grade. Classes will be developed according to entries received. Unless otherwise stated, all breeds to compete together.
2. Cattle will be classified according to the description for each breed. Crossbred cattle will be permitted.

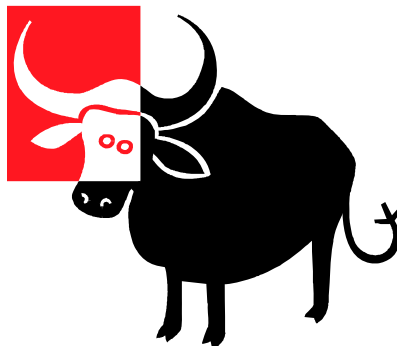
Division C - Market Steers

Market Beef Division Rules

1. **A maximum of two Market Steers may be entered.** All steers must be halter broken by Manageability Check/Weigh In. Animals deemed unsafe by the superintendent will be sifted.
2. Only steers tagged by the committee will be allowed to sell in the auction.
3. Classes will be determined by weight and may be combined at the discretion of the superintendent at check-in and weigh-in.
4. Steers with horns (whether or not they are attached to the skull), scurs, or found to be stags will be sifted. ***The EXPO Committee shall define Horns or Scurs.***
5. Steers over two years of age will be sifted.

Beef Showmanship*

Exhibitors of Market Steers or Breeding Beef may use a breeding or market entry in showmanship competition; both divisions compete together.

- Senior (age 15 – 18)
- Intermediate (age 12 – 14)
- Junior (age 9 to 11)
- Novice (**first year showing a particular species, all ages**)

****Champion Showman in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship will qualify to show in the Large Livestock Round Robin. If an individual qualifies in more than one species, they must choose one and allow the next placing individual in the show in the other species to compete.***

Yavapai County “Bred ‘n Fed”

(Please check box on entry form if entering this class.)

This class is open to steers bred by either the member or purchased by a breeder in Yavapai County. **If Grand or Reserve Champion Steer is not a Yavapai Bred n Fed Steer, then top placing, blue ribbon, steer from each class will be brought back in to compete for this award.** Top placing steer in this class will earn two plaques - one to be presented to the winning exhibitor, the other to be presented to the breeder producing the steer.
