Department Rules

1. 4-H members must be enrolled within the project in which they are exhibiting and must exhibit the required exhibit as stated in the Yavapai County 4-H Project Requirements.
2. **FFA members must be able to show that their project is related to their agriculture education class or an integral part of their Supervised Agricultural Experience.**
3. Work must exhibit the member's own efforts and have been produced within the current 4-H/FFA year; i.e., **July 1, 2008 through April 19, 2009.**
4. Project Evaluation in this department will be by interview evaluation. The member must be present for the interview.
5. CloverKids are only eligible to enter specific CloverKid divisions. CloverKids will not have interviews. **There is no cost for CloverKids to enter.**
6. A complete description of each item must be included on entry form. No project may be larger than 2 feet wide by 4 feet long by 6 feet tall.
7. Educational exhibits must be free standing and should include supporting materials.

8. **Place a 3"x5" exhibitor display label on each exhibit. The display label should contain the name of the item, the name of the exhibitor, name of the project enrolled in and name of the 4-H club or FFA chapter.**
9. To be eligible for a Best of Show Award, the exhibitor must have earned a blue ribbon on their exhibit and interview. The quality of the exhibit item must be deemed superior quality by the judge.

Special Instructions:

1. Display labels should be placed so they can be seen easily.
2. 4-H members are responsible for having wire hangers for their garments. Articles that have been worn or have become soiled should be laundered before exhibiting. Press all clothing exhibits.

Special Event: Class 9. The 4-H Fashion Revue

The 4-H Fashion Revue is a separate event from the clothing exhibits and any member entering completed clothing, knitting or crocheting project (garment) is expected to model it in the Fashion Revue. Each member may model as many outfits as they exhibit. All entries will be awarded a Blue or Red Award. (This event will not take place unless a minimum of ten members enrolled in a 4-H **clothing construction** project enter their projects at EXPO)

To enter, each model must enter into the Fashion Revue on their entry form which is due on February 13, 2009. Additionally, each model must fill out a Fashion Revue narration card (available at the Extension Office) and turn it in at the Extension Office by April 1.

Exhibit Requirements: See 4-H project requirements for suggestions on what to exhibit.

Special instructions:

1. Only non-perishable food exhibits should be entered.
2. Foods should be covered with plastic wrap or in unsealed plastic bags.
3. Quantity of baked goods per exhibit are: Cookie or candy entries (five pieces), biscuits, muffins, etc. (3 pieces), breads, coffee cakes, pies, etc. (1 whole item).
4. **Exhibitor display label (3"x5" card works well for the exhibitor label) should include the name of exhibitor, name of 4-H project, and club.** Label the front side of posters – and the outside of notebooks. Food exhibits should state the kind of cookie, fruit bread, etc., being exhibited. For example – “Ginger Cookies,” “Banana Bread”.
5. Attach a 3x5 card-containing recipe to food exhibit. Include a statement of the primary nutritional contribution of the food. For example – “oatmeal – B vitamins” or “peanut butter – potassium”



Special Class: Class 25 - Favorite Recipe Collection:

Any 4-H member enrolled in any foods and nutrition project may enter their recipe collection in addition to their required foods and nutrition exhibit. Recipe boxes must have an exhibitor label as described above.

Judging Criteria:

1. Recipe collection can be in a file box or in a recipe book form.
2. Member must write or type on 3"x5" or 4"x6" recipe cards.
3. Recipe collection must contain at least 5 major food categories.
4. Recipe collection must include appropriate number of recipes and a variety of food categories.
5. Each recipe must be dated current year in upper right hand corner.
6. Recipes must have been tested (cooked, baked or prepared) by the 4-H member.
7. Current year's recipes should be tabbed or paper clipped so they can be easily located.
8. Recipe collection must include appropriate number of recipes and a variety of food categories.

Juniors (age 9-11) Recipe box with at least 7 new recipes you have prepared this year.

Intermediates (age 12-14) Recipe box with at least 10 new recipes you have prepared this year.

Seniors (age 15-18) Recipe box with at least 15 new recipes you have prepared his year.

Silent and Live Auction

Silent Auction Division Rules

1. Consignment Fee - 50 cents (non-refundable)
2. Limit one (1) entry per division. Item must have been entered in its regular classified division to be eligible for the auction. Items will be judged in their individual divisions before being displayed on the auction table.
3. Exhibitor shall have the option of setting a minimum bid. If minimum bid is not met, exhibitor may remove their item from the auction table no later than **5:00pm, Friday.** Silent Auction shall close 2:00pm, Saturday of EXPO
4. Successful bidders must submit payment by **5:00 pm Saturday of EXPO**
5. Clover Kids are not eligible to enter this division.

Live Auction Division Rules

1. 4-H/FFA Dress Code Required
2. **One** project per exhibitor from Indoor Exhibits will be allowed to sell at auction, provided that item has been designated on the entry form and the item has been judged. Additionally, the Single Sale Rule is in effect. An exhibitor can only sell one animal or item through the Live Auction. **See Rule #5 under general Livestock Auction Rules for additional information.**
3. All ribbon awards: blue, red & white will be permitted to sell.
4. Exhibits sold under Live Auction will follow same rules as livestock.
5. No food items are permitted to be sold through the Live Auction.
