### ENTRY DUE AT TIME OF TAGGING

All Entries Must Include:

- Signed and completed **Entry Form 09LS**, one form for each animal
- Legible **SIDE Color Photo** of animal with exhibitor
- **Bill of Sale**
- Copy of **Seasonal Pass** for entry. Original **Seasonal Pass** for transport to ear tagging.
- Signed **Code of Conduct Form**
- **Quality Assurance** certificate #
- Signed and completed form **W-9**
- **Entry Fee of \$15.00**, payable to "Yavapai County 4H/FFA EXPO" for each animal

Failure to bring all of the above accurately completed and signed to the tagging will result in a late fee assessment of **\$25.00**, for a total fee of **\$35.00 per incomplete entry.**

Friday, **February 12, 2010**

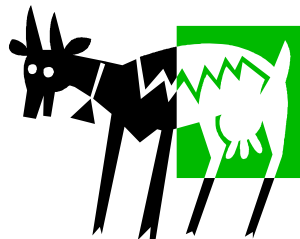

## Division A - Dairy Goats

### **Dairy Goat Division Rules**

1. Animals may be registered or grade. Classes will be developed according to entries received. Classes/Breed Divisions containing less than three (3) entries will be combined to compete within the All Other Breeds Division.
2. Dairy Goats will be classified according to the description for each breed. Dairy crossbreeds will be entered in the All Other Breeds Division.
3. Animals shown in groups may also be shown as individuals.

#### **Best of Udder Class (Class 10)**

Dairy Goat does previously entered in classes 1 – 8 are eligible. Does will be judged on overall dairy character and the quality: shape, balance, & texture of the udder.

## **Division B -Pygmy Goats**

### **Pygmy Goat Division Rules**

1. Animals may be registered or grade.
2. Does and wethers only. **NO BUCKS.**
3. Kid and Senior Classes may be combined at the discretion of the superintendent(s) if less than three (3) entries are received in any class division.

- 319. Senior Doe or Wether (Kidded prior to April 21, 2009)

### **Pygmy Goat Showmanship\***

- Senior (age 15 – 18)
- Intermediate (age 12 – 14)
- Junior (age 9 to 11)
- Novice (**first year showing a particular species, all ages**)

***\*Champion Showman in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship will qualify to show in the Large Livestock Round Robin. If an individual qualifies in more than one species, they must choose one and allow the next placing individual in the show in the other species to compete***

## **Division C - Market Goats**

### **Market Goat Division Rules**

1. **A maximum of two Market Goats may be entered.** Animals may be registered or grade, but must be at least 50% Boer.
2. Wether or doe kids are eligible.
3. Kids entered must have all milk teeth without evidence of eruption of either of two permanent front teeth.
4. Kids must be sheared with no more than 1/2 inch of hair growth over entire body. **Horn must not be more than 2 inches from skull and must be tipped and filled. Dehorned preferred.**
5. Animals are subject to reclassification at weigh-in.

321. Market Goats (All Breeds Competing) 75 lbs. and up

### **Market Goat Showmanship\***

- Senior (age 15 – 18)
- Intermediate (age 12 – 14)
- Junior (age 9 to 11)
- Novice (**first year showing a particular species, all ages**)

***\*Champion Showman in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship will qualify to show in the Large Livestock Round Robin. If an individual qualifies in more than one species, they must choose one and allow the next placing individual in the show in the other species to compete***

## **Yavapai County “Bred ‘n Fed”**

(Please check box on entry form if entering this class.)

This class is open to goats bred by either the member or purchased from a breeder in Yavapai County. **If Grand or Reserve Champion goat is not a Yavapai Bred n Fed goat, then top placing, blue ribbon, goat from each class will be brought back in to compete for this award.** Top placing goat in this class will earn two plaques - one to be presented to the winning exhibitor and one to be presented to the breeder producing the goat.



## **Division D – Angora/Fiber Goats**

### **Angora Goat Division Rules**

1. All goats must be shown with horns.
2. Mohair must be clean and free of debris, not washed.
3. All Angora Goat Association rules apply.
4. No bucks over 4 months of age may be shown.
