- **Entry Fee of \$3.00**, payable to "Yavapai County 4H/FFA EXPO" for each item/animal

Incomplete entries received after February 12, 2010, will be assessed a \$10.00 late fee per entry.

This fee is in addition to the regular entry fee per project item.

All incomplete or late entries must be received by February 20, 2010.

Note: No animals to be brought in prior to April 21, 2010. Animals to be released Saturday, after 5:00 pm. (Cavies may be brought back & forth. All other animals should remain on exhibition)

Department Rules

Division A – Fancy Poultry

Poultry Division Rules

1. All poultry must be leg-banded with numbers corresponding to those on the entry form.
2. Classes will be set according to sub-divisions; i.e., A-1, A-2, B-1, C-3, etc.
3. Birds may be examined at check-in for external parasites. Infested birds must be removed at once from the show area.
4. Meat Pens, or other market birds, Laying Hen, and Pet Poultry are not eligible for Best in Show award.
5. All birds, Classes 1-6 **MUST** be at least 6 months of age. **Broiler Pens, Market Geese, and Market Ducks excluded.**
6. White ribbon Meat Pens, Market Geese, Turkeys, and Ducks will **not** qualify for the auction.

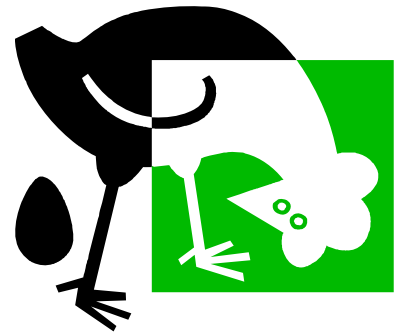

Class 6 - All Other Poultry (Pheasants, Chukars, Quail, Guineas, etc.)

- 501. Cock, Old Drake, Old Gander, Old Tom (Birds over 1 year)
- 502. Hen, Old Duck, Old Goose, Old Hen (Birds over 1 year)
- 503. Cockerel, Young Drake, Young Gander, Young Tom (Birds under 1 year)
- 504. Pullet, Young Duck, Young Goose, Young Hen (Birds under 1 year)

Division B - Broiler Meat Pens

Pen of three birds (Cornish X recommended), between 6 and 9 weeks old. Birds are judged on uniformity of weight, conformation and meat producing qualities. **Weights: Birds within the pen must weigh no less than 3**

pounds or more than 5 pounds. UNDERWEIGHT OR OVERWEIGHT BIRDS WITHIN THE PEN WILL DISQUALIFY THE ENTIRE PEN. Limit One Pen Per Exhibitor.

Division C - Green Duckling

Duck (Pekin or Pekin Cross recommended), between 10 and 12 weeks old. Birds are judged on proper flesh and finished qualities. **Weights: Birds must weigh no less than 6 pounds or more than 8 pounds. Limit One Entry Per Exhibitor.**

Division D - Market Turkey

Young tom or hen turkey six months to one year of age (Broad Breasted White recommended). Judged on proper flesh and finished qualities. **Limit One Entry Per Exhibitor.**

Division E - Market Goose

Young gander or goose (Emden or Emden cross recommended), between 12 and 16 weeks of age. Judged on proper flesh and finished qualities. **Limit One Entry Per Exhibitor.**

Division F - Laying Hen (Pen Size: Minimum 4 - Maximum 6)

Birds entered in this class are judged on their laying qualities, irrespective of breed. Cross-bred and hybrid birds (sex-links, etc.), are encouraged to enter this class.

Division G - Pet Poultry

Open to members in the Poultry Project who do not have a poultry animal entered under any other lot number and whose poultry does not fit any breed classification.

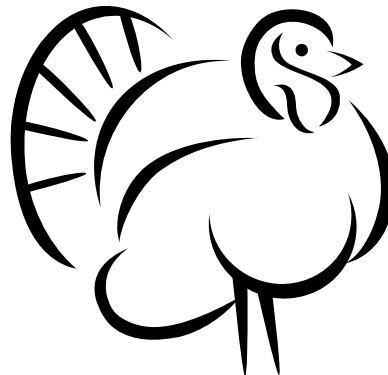
Division H – One-Half Dozen (6) EGGS ALL OF ONE COLOR

Division Rules

1. One-half dozen (6) eggs will constitute entry.
2. One (1) entry per exhibitor per lot allowed – white, brown, blue or green; chicken, duck or any other eggs.
3. On entry form place egg entries under lot and class number using the work “EGG” under Breed, and Color of the egg entry under Variety. Use different line for each entry of eggs.
4. Eggs must be clean, and of Grade AA quality.
5. All eggs in an entry must be of a single size group (small, medium, large)
6. Eggs will be judged for internal and external quality.

Division I – Rabbits

Division Rules

1. Rabbits must be tattooed in the left ear corresponding to number listed on the entry form.
2. Rabbits will be examined at check-in for signs of external parasites, abscesses, snuffles, sore hocks, and diarrhea. Affected animals must be removed at once from the show area.
3. Rabbit Meat Pens, Pet Rabbits, and Doe and Litter are not eligible for Best in Show award.
4. Structural deformities including, but not limited to, malocclusion and/or extremely poor physical condition as determined by the judge, will result in a White Ribbon award.
5. White Ribbon Meat Pens will **not** qualify for the auction.

Class 1 - Breeds Maturing Under 8 Pounds (Incl. Rex)

Note: If four (4) or more rabbits are entered within a breed, that breed will be classed individually.

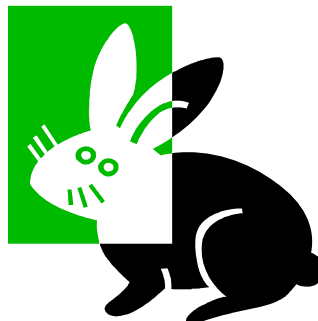
Class 2 - Breeds Maturing Over 8 Pounds (Except Rex)

Note: If four (4) or more rabbits are entered within a breed, that breed will be classed individually.

American, Angora (Giant) Beveran, California, Champagne D'Argent, Checkered Giant, Chinchilla (American), Chinchilla (Giant), Cinnamon, Crème d'Argent, Flemish Giant, Hotot, Lop (English), Lop(French), New Zealand, Palomino, Satin, Silver Fox

Class 3 - Meat Rabbits

Limit One Lot/Pen Per Exhibitor.

Lots

520 Rabbit Meat Pen (Fryers 3 rabbits, 3 to 5 lbs. each, 8 to 10 wks old)

521. Fryer (3 to 5 lbs. 1 rabbit) Fryers may be cross-breed or pure-breed. Age limit not over 10 weeks old. Fryers may not be a part of a meat pen.

522. Roaster (see Roaster weight requirements) Only Commercial Type (Class D) rabbits as defined by the American Rabbit Breeders Association will be accepted. All rabbits are to be not less than 6 months nor more than 8 months of age (**born between August and October**) **The ownership deadlines for these animals is October 1. All roasters must be ear tattooed.**

Roaster Weight Requirements

Crème D'Argent, Palomino, Californian	7.25 - 9.5
Satin	7.5 - 9.5
Cinnamon, Silver Fox	7.5 – 10
Hotot	7.25 – 10
Champagne D'Argent	8 – 10.5
New Zealand, American Chinchilla	8 – 11
French Lop	8 – 12

Min. Weight = 80% of ideal weight of Sr. Buck

Max. Weight = Intermediate Weight of Doe

There will be not deviation from these “dry weight” standards at weigh-in time. Roaster ages are based on the stewed class classification as defined in the ARBA Standard of Perfection.

Class 4 - Pet Rabbit

Open to members in the Rabbit Project who do not have a rabbit entered under any other lot number and whose rabbit does not fit any breed classification.

Class 5 - Doe and Litter

Doe and litter (4 weeks to 8 weeks of age). This division is judged based on the relative condition of the doe and the uniformity and condition of the litter. **Bunnies entered in Doe and Litter classes ARE NOT eligible for meat pen competition or Best in Show Award.**

525. Doe and Litter - Light Breeds (weight of doe 6 - 8 lbs.)

Division J - Cavies (All Breeds Competing)

Division Rules

1. Must be ear-tagged in the left ear and correspond to entry form.
2. Cavies will be examined at check-in for signs of external parasites, abscesses, snuffles, sore hocks, and diarrhea. Affected animals must be removed at once from the show area.
3. Structural deformities including, but not limited to, malocclusion and/or extremely poor physical condition as determined by the judge, will result in a White Ribbon award.

- 528. Senior Sow (Over 6 mos. or over 32 oz.)
- 529. Intermediate Boar (Up to 6 mos. or 22 - 31 oz.)

- 531. Junior Boar (Up to 4 mos. or 12 - 21 oz.)
- 532. Junior Sow (Up to 4 mos. or 12 - 21 oz.)



Division K - Pigeons

Division Rules

Pigeons owned by second year or more project members **must** have sealed leg bands.

Class 1 - Fancy Pigeons (Cropper, Dragoon, Fantail, Frill, Frillback, German Beauty Homer, Jacobin, Modena, Nun, Owl, Pheasant, Pouter, Trumpeter, and Tumbler)

Class 2 - Performance Pigeons (Racing Homer, Roller, Highflier, and Parlor Tumbler)

Class 3 - Utility Pigeons (King, Carneau, French Mondain, Runt, and Rumbler)

Class 4 - Pet Pigeons

Open to members in the Pigeon Project who do not have a Pigeon entered under any other lot number and whose Pigeon does not fit any breed classification.

Small Stock Showmanship*

Showmanship will be conducted by Division, following confirmation.

- Senior (age 15 – 18)
- Intermediate (age 12 – 14)
- Junior (age 9 to 11)
- Novice (**first year showing a particular species, all ages**)

****Champion Showman in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship will qualify to show in the Small Livestock Round Robin. If an individual qualifies in more than one species, they must choose one and allow the next placing individual in the show in the other species to compete***

Small Livestock Round Robin

Round Robin Rules

1. This contest is open to the Grand Champion winners of the Senior, Intermediate, and Junior Divisions of Showmanship in Rabbit, Pigeon, Poultry, Water Fowl, Turkey and Cavy .
2. If the Grand Champion Showman for an area does not wish to show then only the Reserve Champion Showman for that area may replace that individual.
3. Each contestant must own one of the animals shown, and each contestant must show all the different kinds of stock; unless safety is a factor, then the judge's discretion is final. Superintendent's will advise judge of safety factors.
4. Contestants will be judged as follows:
 - Presentation and Handling of Animal
 - Moving or Leading..... 15%
 - Questions..... 15%
 - Show Animal to Best Advantage..... 15%
 - Poise, Alertness and Attitude..... 15%
 - Appearance of Contestant.....20%
 - Ability to follow Instruction of Judge.....20%
5. Award of All-Around Champion Small Livestock will be given to the high scoring contestant on the basis of total points earned.

Wayne Johnson Memorial Award

Selection Process:

Per the family's direction this is to be a high point award **based upon the point value of the awards won in Showmanship and conformation.**

SHOWMANSHIP

Grand Champion = 12 points
Reserve Champion = 10 points
Blue Ribbons = 6 points
Red Ribbons = 4 points
White Ribbons = 2 points



CONFORMATION

Best of Show = 12 points
Best of Breed = 10 points
Blue Ribbons = 6 points
Red Ribbons = 4 points
White Ribbons = 2 points
