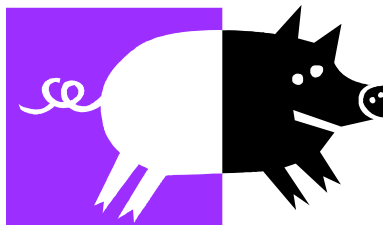

All general EXPO rules and regulations apply. Read Carefully.

Department Rules

- All animals must be identified with an Arizona Department of Agriculture Premises I.D. Number either permanently tattooed or affixed to the animal by means of a *tamper-proof* ear tag.
- All swine must have state inspection (hauling papers) that indicates the Premises ID number. Inspection paperwork must be shown prior to showing animal. **If inspection was not done at time of purchase you must contact the Arizona Department of Agriculture at 1-800-294-0305 to make an appointment.**
- 4-H Volunteers and FFA Advisors will be issued identification badges. The badges will be required for entry into the show barns/tents during show hours.

Division A - Breeding Swine

Breeding Swine Division Rules

1. Animals may be either registered or grade. Classes will be developed according to entries received. Classes/Divisions containing less than three (3) entries will be combined to compete within the *All Other Recognized Breeds* category.
2. Swine will be classified according to the description for each breed. Crossbred swine will be entered in the All Other Breed Category.

Class 1 - All Breeds and Crossbreeds

Lots to be determined based on entries

*** Sows with litters at the show must stay locked in pens and will be judged in their stalls. Pens must remain secure and locked at all times and only the owner of the sow will handle the sow and piglets.**

NO VISITORS IN PENS - OWNER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SOW'S ACTIONS.

Division B - Market Swine

Market Swine Division Rules

1. **A maximum of two Market Swine may be entered.** Hogs will be classified into weight and breed categories will be posted by Friday 8:00 a.m. Hogs weighing less than 210 pound will show as feeders, and will be ineligible for sale through the auction.
 2. Animals may be registered or grade. Market divisions containing less than three (3) entries will be combined to compete in the All Other Breeds Category.
 3. Animals will be subject to re-classification at weigh-in, or before Friday 8:00 am.
 4. Both gilts and barrows are eligible to show in market classes. All market swine must be less than 7 ½ months old as indicated on the ID form.
 5. Barrows showing evidence of undescended testicles or being a stag will be sifted.
-
- **Class 1 - Duroc** (Must be red, with droopy ears, and show no white spots or markings. Black spots must be no larger than a quarter.)
 - **Class 2 - Hampshire** (Must be black with white belt encircling the front legs and shoulders. Must have erect ears. Any variation of belt will be considered by superintendents before market show.)
 - **Class 3 - Yorkshire** (Must be all white with erect ears. Any “freckles” present must be no larger than a silver dollar, when combined, or bigger then a quarter alone.)
 - **Class 4 - All Other Purebreds**
 - **Class 5 – Crossbreds**

407. Feeder Swine – 209 lbs. and under. (Feeder swine will not be classified as to breed and are not eligible to sell in the auction.)
408. Market Swine - 210 lbs. and up. (Maximum Buyer Pay Weight **270** pounds)

(Pork Industry Board defines a “Market Weight Pig” as one that has reached between 240 to 280 lbs. and are between the ages of 6 to 7 mos.)

Swine Showmanship*

Exhibitors of Market Swine or Breeding Swine may use a breeding or market entry in showmanship competition; both divisions compete together.

- Senior (age 15 – 18)
- Intermediate (age 12 – 14)
- Junior (age 9 to 11)
- Novice (**first year showing a particular species, all ages**)

****Champion Showman in Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship will qualify to show in the Large Livestock Round Robin. If an individual qualifies in more than one species, they must choose one and allow the next placing individual in the show in the other species to compete.***

Yavapai County “Bred ‘n Fed”
(Please check box on entry form if entering this class.)

This division is open to market hogs bred by either the member or purchased from a breeder in Yavapai County. If Grand or Reserve Champion hog is not a Yavapai Bred n Fed hog, then top placing, blue ribbon, hog from each class will be brought back in to compete for this award Top placing hog in this class will earn two plaques - one to be presented to the winning exhibitor, and one to be presented to the breeder producing the hog.
